# Coca-Cola ON TRIAL

## PUBLIC MEETING



Five hundred years after the arrival of the Spanish conquistadores Colombia is still not free. Social movements are under threat when they try to defend their rights to public services, land, freedom of expression and even life.

Multinationals are using the army and right-wing paramilitary groups to discipline the country for exploitation of its labour and natural resources. One of the biggest, Coca-Cola, is at the centre of serious and well documented claims of assassination and suppression of trade unionists in its bottling plants.
